In undertaking this monumental goal, the hymnal committee has chosen test-site churches to assist in the hymnal creation process. Director of Music, Noel Sell, is pleased to announce that the Presbyterian Church at Pluckemin is one of those worshipping communities. Chosen churches will receive four hymns or songs every three months with the hope that these pieces will be used in worship more than once and that feedback will be provided.

The first set of four hymns and songs has already arrived, two of which are traditional hymns; one is an ethnic song of Chinese origin, not yet published; and one, a praise song composed in 2008. Look for these titles in the weeks to come:

*I would like to thank the Session of Pluckemin Presbyterian Church for approving the new ministry: The Pluckemin Medical Equipment Ministry.*

*On May 27, my father was in the ER at Somerset Medical Center. He was very weak and unable to walk on his own. He was not admitted to the hospital that night and went home with his live-in aide. The next morning, he needed to go to dialysis. Because he was so weak, we knew he was in need of a wheelchair IMMEDIATELY. But, how do you locate one at 10:00 on a Thursday evening?*

*Well, you ask for God's help. And His help came to me when I went home that evening and saw The Pluckeminews in my mail. I opened it up and immediately saw the article on the Medical Equipment Ministry. I called the number listed and left a message saying that I was in desperate need of a wheelchair. The following morning -- at 8 a.m. -- I received a call from Dave Hayward. He said he could meet me at the church that morning. I met with him and picked up a chair for my father. This truly was a Godsend, as my father's aide said that he never would have been able to get my father to his dialysis treatment without a wheelchair. It was life saving in so many ways.*

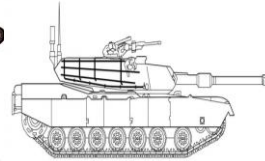

### **The Story of Our Baptismal Font**

(as told by former member Nancy Flynn)

The Pluckemin Church families who had lost their sons in World War II decided to purchase a baptismal font for the church in memory of their sons.

In the case of my great uncle, John Jacob Kopf (my father's father's brother), it was especially meaningful because he had been involved with the Boy Scouts from an early age as a leader, and was more of a "big brother" to all the youth that he led. Uncle Jakie (as he was known by all) had married only a year or two before going into the Navy and had never had any children of his own...but everyone says he was meant to be a father – he was so kind-hearted and caring with kids (including my Dad).

Uncle Jakie was on the last ship to be lost in the war...the U.S. submarine Bullhead was in the Pacific Ocean when it failed to respond to messages just two days before the surrender of Japan.

There is a memorial gravestone in the Pluckemin Cemetery in John Jacob Kopf's honor, surrounded by several of his immediate family members who are buried there as well.
